Traditional Owners leading monitoring in the Great Barrier Reef and Catchment

The Traditional Owner-led Integrated Monitoring and Reporting Program under the Reef Trust Partnership is an opportunity for Reef Traditional Owners to lead monitoring of our culture and heritage values. Traditional Owners on the Technical Working Group are designing the Integrated Monitoring and Reporting Program in partnership with the Great Barrier Reef Foundation using a Traditional Owner approach. Research support is provided from CSIRO.

Traditional Owners leading the work

Traditional Owners ideas and knowledge are leading the design of the program. Every person's experience and knowledge is listened to, respected and recognised. Team members who are not Traditional Owners respectfully support Traditional Owners who lead the program.

Traditional Owner perspectives shape the program

We have been monitoring the health of our People and Country for millennia. Our monitoring is about a holistic view of Country where People, Culture and Country are deeply connected. Our understanding of monitoring is different to the definition in Western science. It is important that we are in the driving seat, making decisions about our own monitoring and reporting.

We bring knowledge about how our communities work. We want to make sure communities can succeed and have control over their monitoring projects, their data and their knowledge.
